Proposed Project Details and Objectives: The Mai Kao OrBaTor Khun Sompol (local elected government official) was originally contacted by US Navy League member Larry Amsden concerning the upcoming 7th year anniversary of the 26 December 2004 Asian Tsunami. Larry knew the Phuket Tsunami Memorial "The wall of Remembrance" which contains the names for the 45 countries that lost their own citizens lives in Thailand, was I need of a face lift. The Thai government reported 4,812 confirmed deaths, 8,457 injuries, and 4,499 missing after the country was hit by a tsunami caused by the Indian Ocean earthquake on 26 December 2004. The Thai authorities estimate that at least 8,150 are likely to have died, other NGO's estimate as high as 20,000 deaths. The local OrBaTor immediately loved the idea of the USS Pickney assisting in the restoration of the Tsunami Memorial prior to all the yearly memorial services and pilgrimages made by those that lost loved ones in the Tsunami on December 26th 2004.

For this COMSERV Project, the local OrBaTor cut the grass and washed down the dust from the "Wall of Remembrance" and make it ready for paint the day before. On COMSERV Day the USS Pickney and local area volunteers used weed whackers to finish off cutting the tall grass around the wall, cleaned the wall with wire brushes, and painted white the entire length of the wall. 31 of the 45 country flags were purchased with the remaining 14 ordered. It was noted that the 45 country flag holders also need to be replaced so they were removed for repair / replacement. The 45 country flag poles and holders will be repaired or replaced and installed onto the memorial wall as soon as possible to complete this project before the 26t of December Tsunami memorial ceremony. To complete this project, the remaining 14 country flags that make up the total of 45 countries that lost citizens in the Tsunami have to be ordered and purchased at Baht 250 each (Total Baht 3,500), and new wooden flag poles with flag pole holders to be attached to the wall above each country (estimate Baht 300 x 45 = Baht 13,500), for a total needed to complete this project approximately Baht 16,000.
